2. National Test Scores (SAT and/or ACT)	20 Points
3. Applicant's Essay	20 Points
4. Two letters of recommendation	10 Points
5. School-related activities, societies/organizations, and/or work experience	20 Points
6. Honors, Awards	<u>10 Points</u>

Total: 100 Points

 - 2) An official High School transcript
 - 3) Two letters of recommendation – **one** from the applicant's counselor, department head, or a faculty advisor, and **one** from a teacher of the applicant
 - 4) Applicant's essay (The "essay" provides an opportunity for you to discuss, in narrative form, reasons why you might benefit from such a scholarship, how such a scholarship might be helpful in achieving your goals and aspirations, or any information that might help the committee learn more about you.)
 - 5) A short autobiography (A short autobiography is an opportunity for you to provide the committee with a brief account of your life and background in narrative form.
 - 6) One wallet size photo
3. Application material will not be returned to the applicant.
4. Notification to scholarship recipients is expected by May 23, 2026.
